Arnold & Shinjo Systems supplier for industrial sheet metal production

Arnold & Shinjo GmbH & Co. KG was established in December 1994 as a subsidiary of Adolf Würth GmbH & Co. KG.

In the beginning, the company had the idea of introducing the PIAS® piercing nut system, which was already established in Japan, to the European market.

Arnold & Shinjo developed from a pure trading company to a systems supplier that supports its customers in planning, designing and implementing their tools for the sheet metal production.

The name of the company resulted from combining the names of two well-known companies, Arnold Umformtechnik GmbH & Co. KG, Germany and the licenser Y. Shinjo, Japan.

The firm began business at the site of Arnold Umformtechnik GmbH & Co. KG. In 1996 the company moved into the renovated building of the so-called "Old Factory."

This building, which is under preservation order, was the origin of Arnold screw production in Ernsbach over 100 years ago.

With its qualified and highlymotivated employees the company was able to establish itself in a strongly competitive market in the following years and to continually achieve an above-average expansion of its market share. In 1998 Arnold & Shinjo was certified according to DIN EN ISO 9001, and today it is a direct supplier to European automobile manufacturers.

Arnold&Shinjo is a 100 percent subsidiary of the global Würth Group with 54,900 employees and 375 companies in 83 countries and global sales of over 7.74bn Euro.
